## **Posting of Meeting**

## **Review Agenda and Approve/Review Previous Minutes and Approve**

## **Communications**

**DNR Inspection--the DNR viewed final cover construction progress on the eastern sideslope, stockpiled papermill sludge and auto shredder fluff(with no issues), GCL and geomembrane had been deployed on about 20% of the northern portion of the final cover, and tires set aside to be taken out of the landfill.**

**10/26/21 DNR Inspection-the entire final cover had been blacked out with geomembrane, destructive test locations repaired via extrusion welding were observed.**

**Plan of Operation Modification Request--requesting a modified cap slope of 3.25:1 in transition areas due to settlement of waste.-----to match current capped cell that sunk with the new height of the next newly capped cell. Acknowledgement of the Plan Modification was from the DNR**

**GEMS Data Submittal--January-June 2021 data, this included monthly gas blower readings and monthly site condition and gas extraction well monitoring data. No methane was detected. There was one deviation of the solid waste monitoring requirement for the vertical gas extraction wells. In March GW-7C the readings did not store properly in the Envision gas meter and it resulted in missed monthly well flow, well pressure and header readings. The missed readings were noted by site personnel after the end of the calendar month. The leachate volume was down about 10 million gallons, due to little snow and rain.**

**Issues and Concerns: The power plant will be shut down at the end of the year(December 31, 2021. There is 2 flares being used. No power will be going to the electric company, that powered about 2800 homes.**
